

Invocation (based on Galatians 1:3-7)

a-bides, His Word

P: In the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.


God

P: Grace and peace to you from God the Father and our Lord Jesus Christ,

C: who gave himself for our sins

un-chang-ing; God the first, and God the last.

- P: to rescue us from this present evil age.
- C: To Him be the glory forever and ever!
- P: There's really no other Gospel in the world that says:
- C: we're saved by grace.
- P: No other religion where
- C: eternal life is a gift of God.
- P: You were unfree, slaves to sin, but now in Jesus Christ,

Confession and Absolution (based on Galatians 2:16-17,20)


P: No one is justified by the works of the Law.

No one is made righteous by their actions.

C: We are not righteous in God's sight. We have been found to be sinners.

Pause in silence in remembrance of our sins

- P: But you have been crucified with Christ, and you now live and have the hope of life after death through the faithfulness of Christ Jesus who loves you and gave Himself on the cross for you. Therefore, in the stead and by the command of my Lord Jesus Christ, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen.
- P: Christ has set you free.
- C: He has freed the unfree. Alleluia.




(Sunday) Children's Message

Galatians Reading: 1:11-24 - pages 2&4 in New English Translation journal booklet ("Paul's Vindication of His Apostleship")


- L: This is the Word of the Lord.

Collect (Prayer of the Day—Gal. 1:1-3,11-12) adapted from Eugene Peterson's translation The Message P: Let us pray. Praise to You, Father God, who has raised Jesus the Messiah from the dead, and Who has given us this Gospel-Good-News for the sake of our salvation. May Your grace and peace always keep this Gospel-Good-News as our Message—which didn't come to us from mere human optimism. We didn't just receive it through the traditions, and we weren't just taught it in some human school. No, we praise You that the Gospel-Good-News has come down to us in Your Word, straight from You, and we have received the Message from Jesus Christ by the work of Holy Spirit. In the Name of Jesus Christ, we pray.

Sermon



Confession of Faith (spoken in unison) (based on Galatians 3:6-14,4:4-7)

Our forefather of the faith Abraham believed God, and it was credited to him as righteousness.

We who believe are the descendants of Abraham, just as God told Abraham:

"All the nations will be blessed in you."

No one is justified before God by the law,

because the righteous one will live by faith.

Christ redeemed us from the curse of the law by becoming a curse for us, so that the blessing promised to Abraham would come to us, and by faith, we could receive the promise of the Spirit.

Because when the appropriate time had come,

God sent out his Son, born of a woman, born under the law,


to redeem those who were under the law,

so that we may be adopted as children with full rights.

And because we are His children, God sent the Spirit of His Son into our hearts, so that we call to God saying, "Abba! Father!" So we are no longer slaves but His children, who will inherit the gift of eternal life through God. Amen.
